I still cannot remember him.

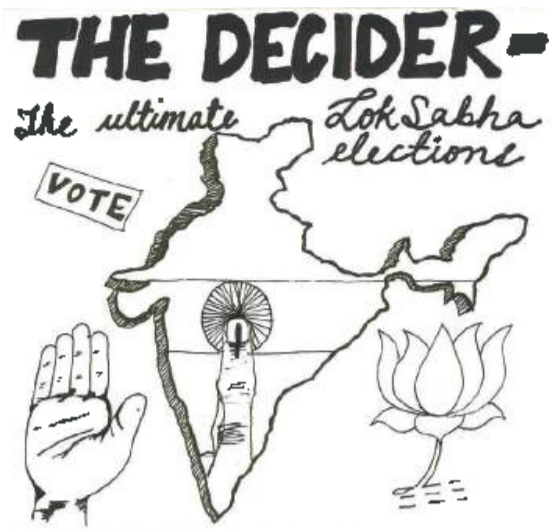
Have a look at the game of life,

The Duel for the End-Who are the Pros?

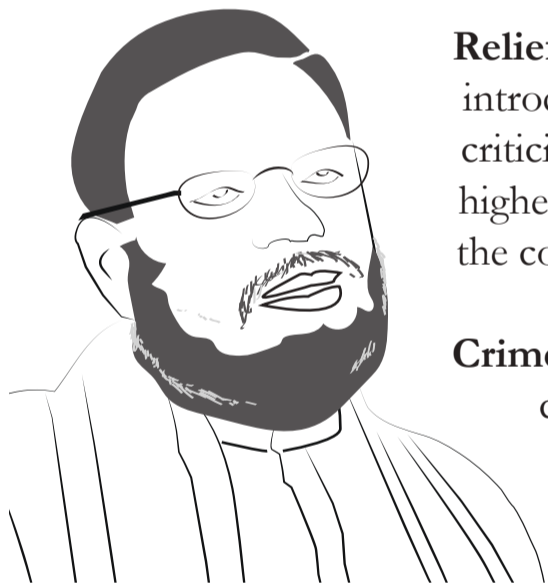

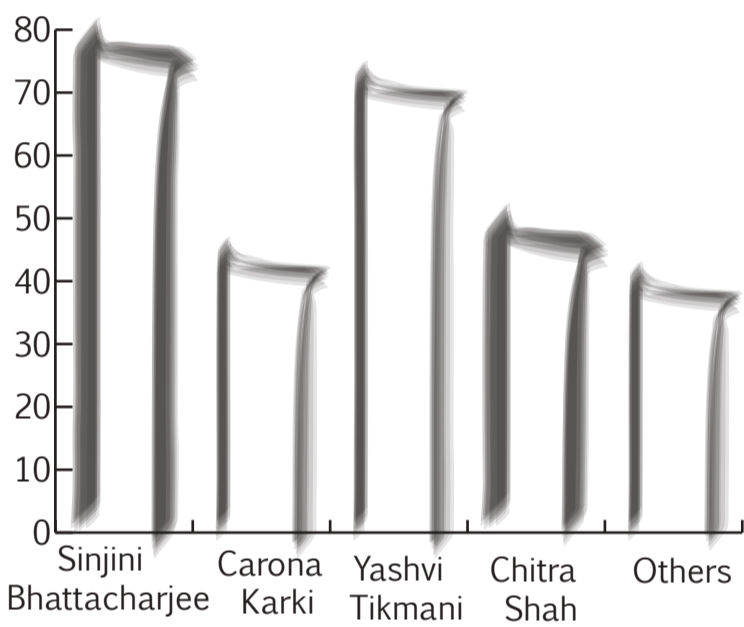
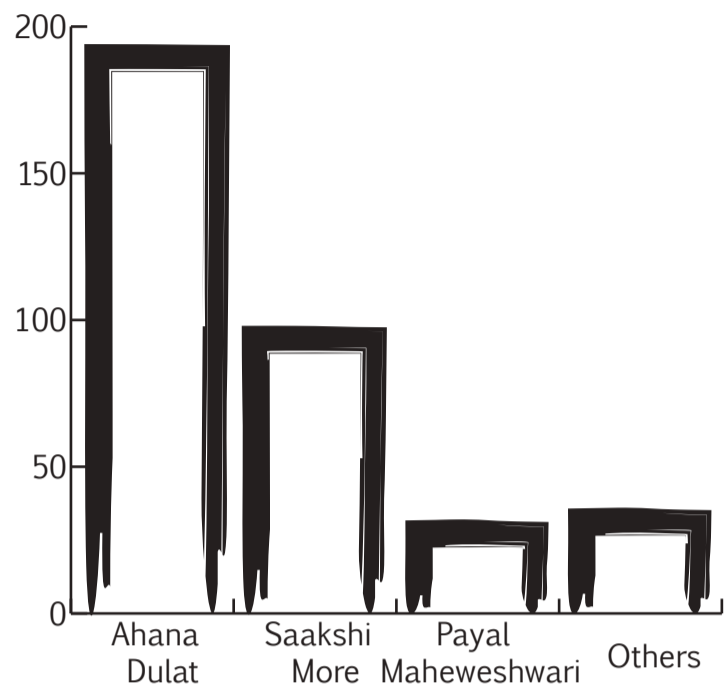


ABKI BAAR KISKI SARIKAR?

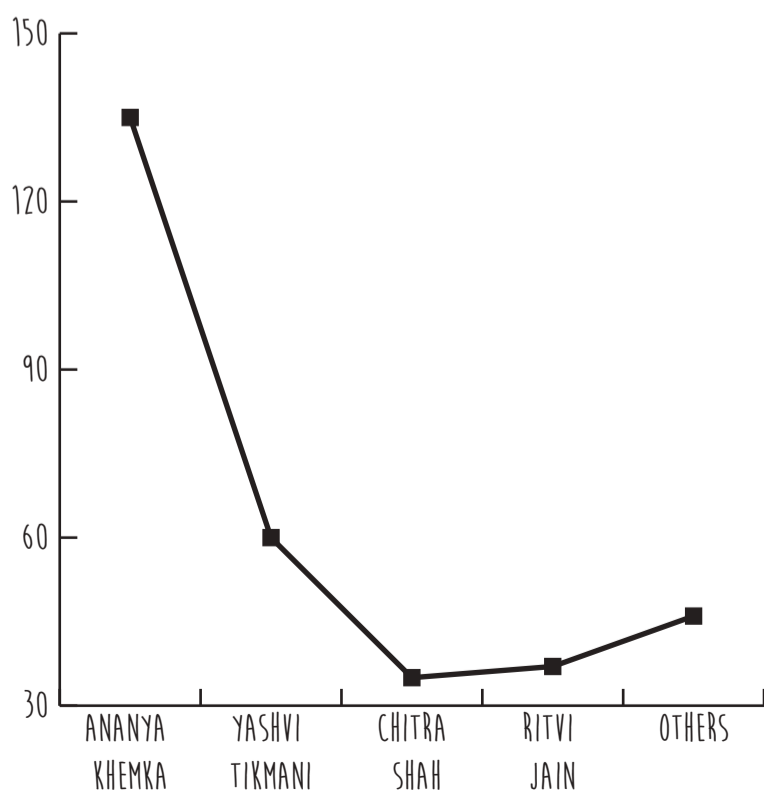
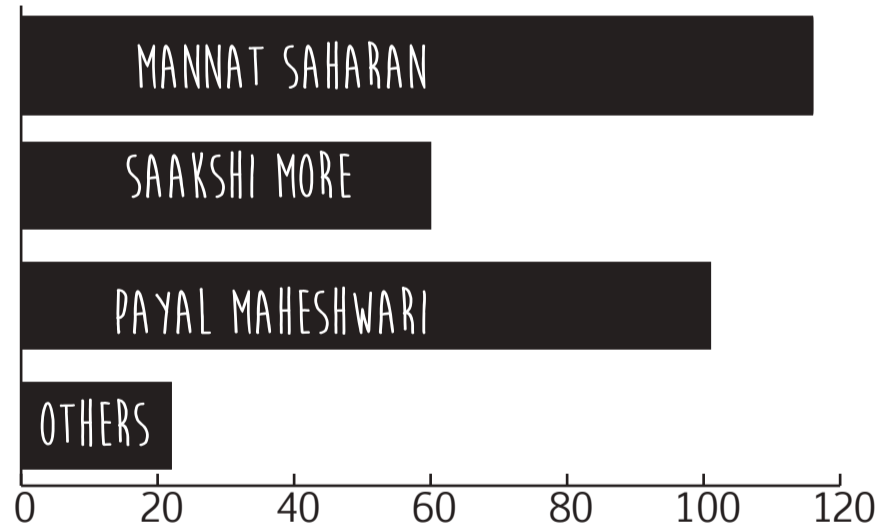


VICE HEAD GIRL

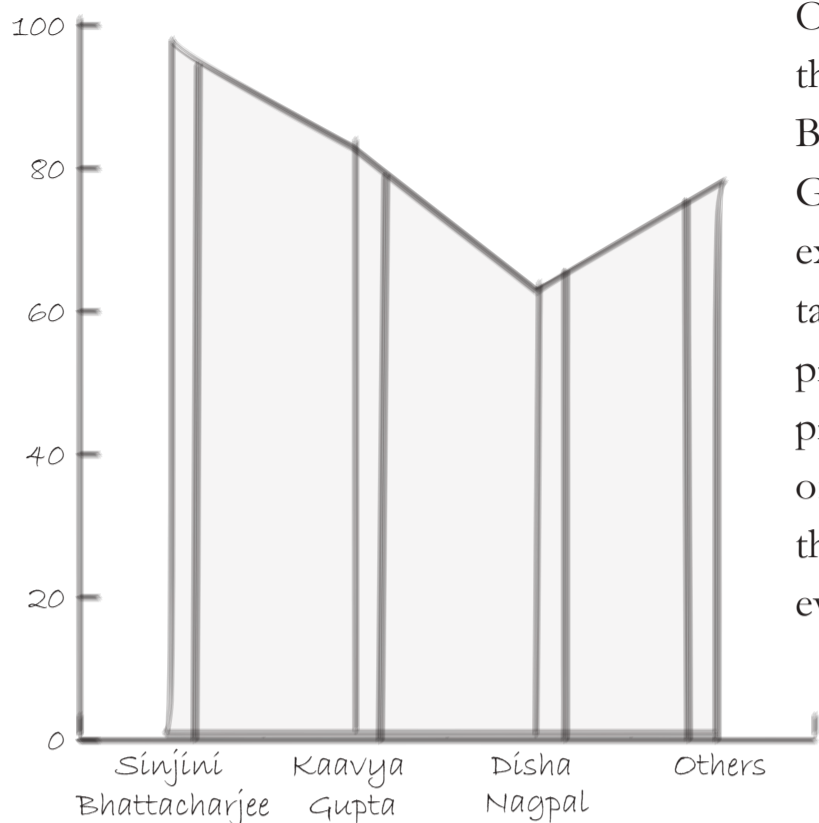
VICE ACADEMIC PREFECT

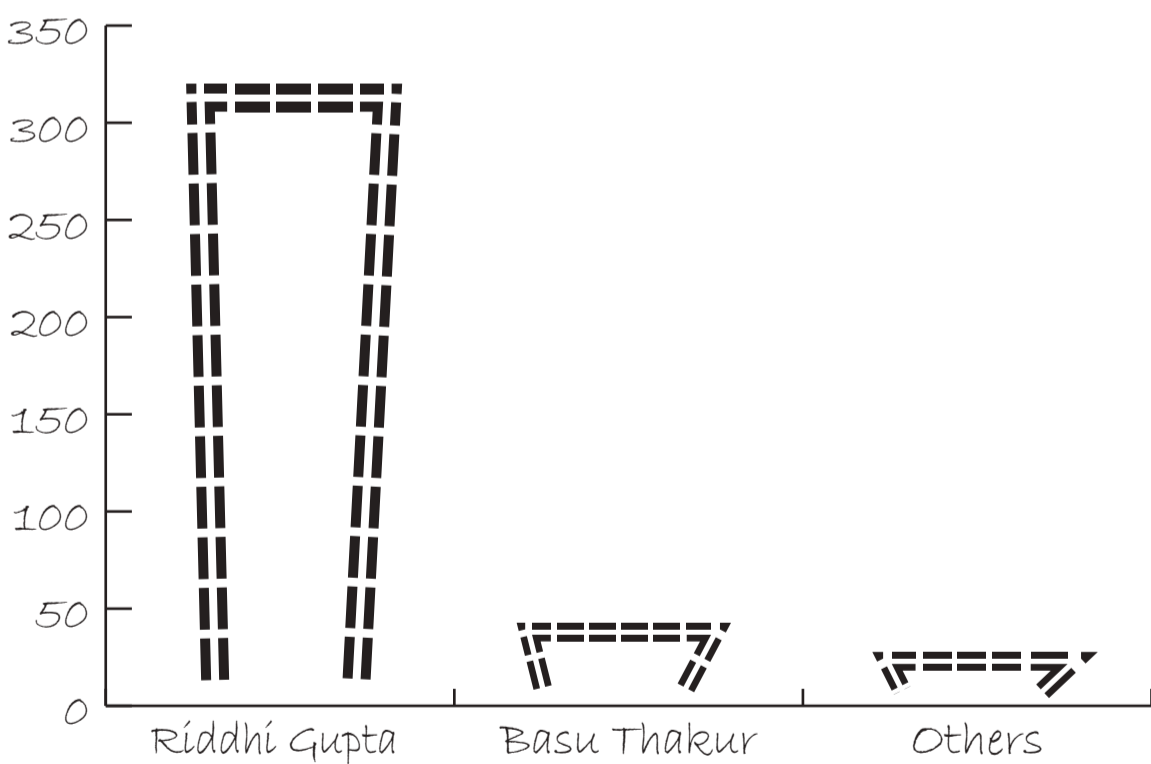
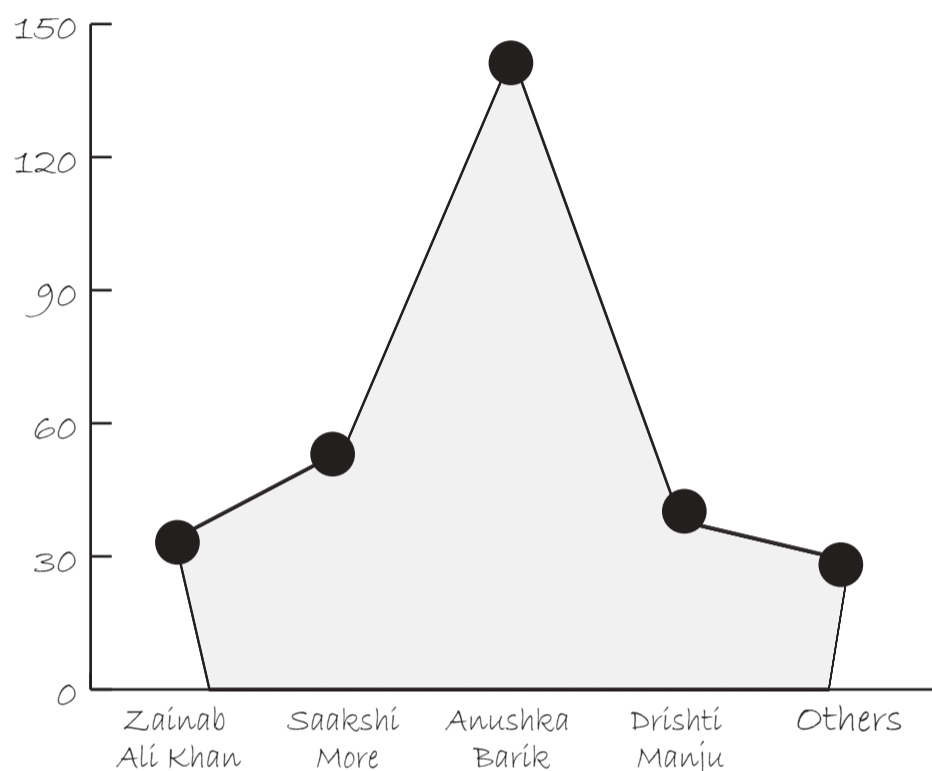
VICE ACTIVITY PREFECT

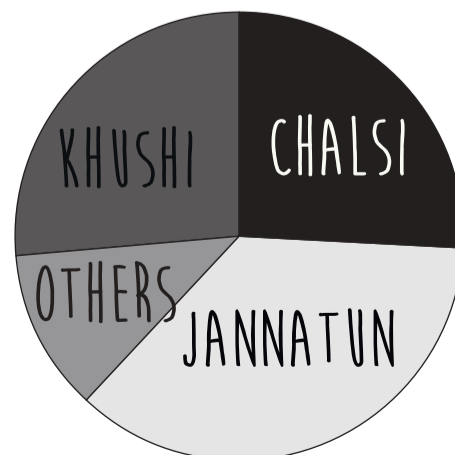
SPORTS PREFECT

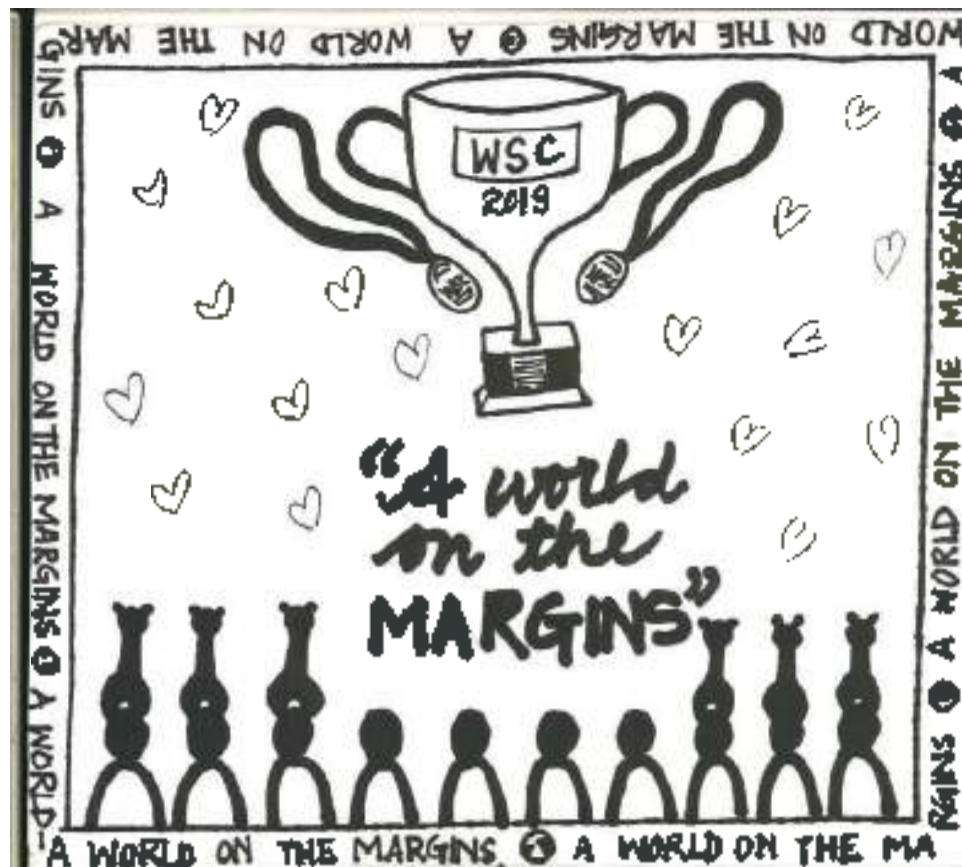
Cupid Injures Scholars!

A FEW WORDS OF GRATITUDE

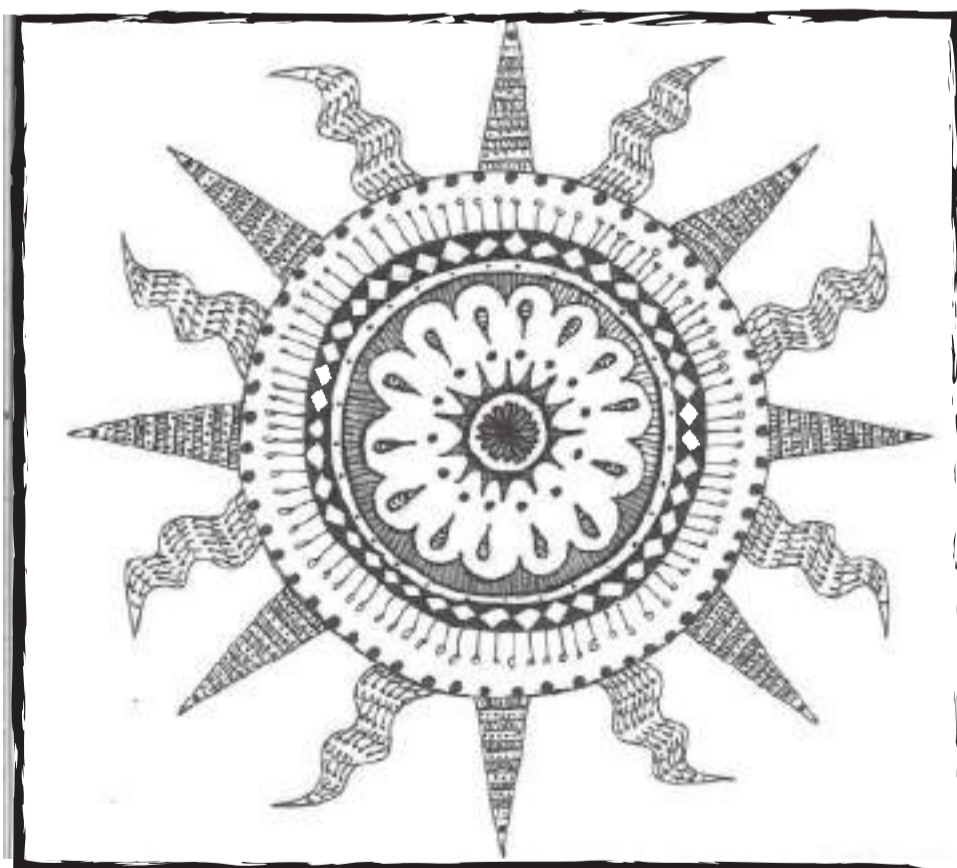
