






2nd Best Girls' Residential School






Harmony 2022




Srijanayam














All India Open School Chess Tournament

Second Position in CISCE Badminton Regionals




Second Position in CISCE Regional Tennis




Avika Dhukia of grade VIII participated in category 4. She enacted the role and delivered the speech of Sarojini Naidu in the final round.








First Position in Silver Fiesta 2022



How to be a Responsible Cyber Citizen


In this digital world, where children are increasingly wired to social media and the internet, the concerns of cyber security, cyberbullying, and cyber hygiene are pertinent.



Academic Achievements

International Exchange Programmes

To give our students an international perspective, every year we send a certain percentage of them for exchange programmes and educational excursions and tours overseas to countries like New Zealand, Australia, UK, Switzerland and US.

Summary of Sports and Life Skill Development Activities

OVERALL

Yesterday a detailed sports report was read out during the Annual Sports Meet – Spardha 2021, however, I bring you a few key highlights:

- Thirty girls from the school participated in various events in Youth, Junior and Senior Women category in the "19th Uttarakhand State Shooting Open Championship in Small Bore Rifle, Pistol and Shotgun Events" which was conducted from 1st to 10th of February 2021 by Uttaranchal State Rifle Association. Our girls bagged 24 Gold, 14 Silver and 10 Bronze medals in the overall tally. Our sharpshooter, Jaanvi Bhartiya clinched 4 Gold, 1 silver and 2 bronze medals in various weapon categories. The school was declared overall champions.
- 27 students participated in the 40th North Zone Shooting Championship from 23rd
 March to 6th April 2021. 10 girls qualified for the National Shooting Championship.
- 18 Students appeared for the NCC 'A' Certificate Examination. Currently a total of 50 students are enrolled for the programme.

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Workshops

Chief Guest's Speech Padam Shri Dr. Yogi Aeron

Namaste everyone!

I can deliver my thoughts better in Hindi. I am sure you are interested in the subject, not in the language.

I would like to tell you that our country has a population of about 130 crore people. I think about 13-crore people of your age would be in the country, but only you are privileged to be studying in an esteemed institution like Unison. I congratulate the management, and the teaching faculty who work and strive to improve your abilities. You must understand that you're lucky to study at such a remarkable institution.



If I go back to my childhood, (when I was) of your age, I used to study at a village school. I walked barefoot, as I had no slippers. From that status, I had never dreamt that such schools exist where you are studying. You deserve compliments.

I would like to warn you about one thing. Children of the same parentage attain different levels of success. Lal Bahadur Shastri were twelve siblings, but it was only he who became the Prime minister of the country. You must remember that no matter how good your school is, your individual capacity is of extreme importance. Never compromise, this is just the beginning of your journey, children. If I have reached here from that level, you are already beginning from a very high level. Your success should be like 'sky is the limit'. Some of you would scale such heights that you would set up another grand institution like this one. Do not compromise! Continue enhancing your capabilities.

Secondly, I would like to tell you all, never try to copy others. You are syndromes of your own, syndrome means 'collective characteristics' which vary for all. For example, when skin gets burnt, we need to graft another in its place, to shield the body from all the viruses and harmful bacteria present in this environment. So, you must understand that when our skin gets burnt, we have to graft new skin there, as fully burnt skin will never develop. Lack of skin as a cover will lead to bacterial infection in our protein-rich body. If we transplant someone else's skin in its place, on identifying it as foreign, the body will stop nourishing it. The patch of the skin of the donor will shed off in a few days. Which means that we all are individuals (and must) never copy others. All will progress differently. I am sure you will progress immensely.

I have witnessed your talent, your energy level. I am awestruck. I have been visiting different countries but after seeing the immense talent that the management and staff here have developed in you, I am amazed. My home is a minute's drive from here, I have been living there for forty years now, and surprisingly, I have been unaware of this fact.

Despite being from such a background, I have been doing plastic surgery for fifty years, now. When I came to Dehradun for the first time, I found that this city had no plastic surgeons. The only city where I could find a plastic surgeon was Delhi. Despite having a degree, I went to many places and remained jobless as, in those days, there was no department of plastic surgery. Therefore, I remained unemployed for a long period of time. I survived on financial aid from my father. It was he who paid my bills, but I did not lose heart. I went to many other places, around 150 km radius of Dehradun, met the doctors to make them aware that I could perform surgery, told them to give me a chance to do it without payment. Children, it took me a long time to convince them. Today, I have hundred techniques, which are original, they are different from all others. I am trying to get them published.

I am the director of an NGO 'Research', the base of which is Stanford University. They have their outlet here called The Outreach Centre, and one of the best is in Dehradun. A team of fifteen doctors visits here from America and provides free service and stays at its own expense. The government of Uttarakhand publicizes it in the state, gathers patients to be treated by the surgeons. This made me realise that if such affluent Americans come to serve people in my country, why shouldn't I. So,

gradually I started this mission.

There is so much poverty in our hills, think for once, how many people can benefit from your talent. If your talent is only for a single individual or a family, then that is a misuse of your talent. Therefore, you must use it as effectively as you can. I'm always trying to treat a large number of patients. At present, Uttarakhand has more than 100 plastic surgeons including me. I got my job at Doon Hospital which was much needed as I was married. Honestly speaking, I lived like a pauper, and learned plastic surgery. When I came to Dehradun, no one was aware of plastic surgery, I could not find operation theaters, instruments, or patients. So, I left the job but persevered diligently. So, (I am) from zero to this, and you are already above 50 percent. Always remember this.

I would like to add that never think about what others are saying or what they will say (for you). Don't bother. If you have talent, manifest it in your actions, you walk on the right path and don't copy others. Everyone has a different DNA, even siblings have a different DNA that is why work according to yourself. Let nobody guide you as you are different from others. My suggestion to you is to identify your talent and never compromise, results are never instant. There are patients I have been treating for around 4 years but I never compromised. People say I am such an accomplished doctor but rearing rabbits, planting trees. But no one could change me and today, my venture 'Jungle-Mangal' is in the Guinness book of world records and my items of topiary are the world's best topiary items.

Talented and capable people like you, are beyond my imagination. The background that I am from, this is beyond my imagination. The ones who are guiding such proficient students and nourishing them, cannot be ordinary people. So, you must never compromise, try new things and never copy others. We are all different and never worry about what others would think.

I am very glad and humbled to have received such high acclaim from you. I will not deny the fact that there are other good institutions, but you are fortunate to be here at Unison, you have innumerable opportunities. I witnessed your talent and surely it was no less than any talent of international level. I am very proud that I have an institution like Unison in the place I live. This world depends upon five percent of people and not on the other 95 percent. You are among those five percent of the people of the world.

Enhance your talent, you should have the biggest canvas on which you can paint. Your performance depends on how large the area you are involved in is. So, Jungle Mangal is open to you. I will be proud to say that Jungle Mangal is affiliated to an institution like Unison World School.





Overall, the program was well organized and the visit to NUS was an enriching experience for the students and staff.

































































































